#### RESOURCE

Executive functioning deficits are like having trouble with the brain's "boss" or "manager." This boss is responsible for organizing tasks, making plans, controlling impulses, and staying focused. When someone has deficits in executive functioning, they might struggle with things like:

- 1. Planning: Finding it hard to make a plan or stick to it.
- 2. Organization: Need help keeping things in order or remembering where things are.
- 3. Attention: Difficulty staying focused on one task without getting distracted.
- 4. Impulse Control: Acting on impulses without thinking about the consequences.

This often results in students appearing to be unfocused, not completing assignments, or not getting along with peers.
